


APA Style CENTRAL® – Adding References to Papers

APA Style CENTRAL allows you to save references to a list as you do your research, which you can then cite in papers in the Writing Center. **My References** is the full list of references associated with your individual login and can be accessed through the Research Center.




References can be added to **My References** in three ways:

- **Search** more than 4 million references adapted from PsycINFO that cover the major works of psychology and behavioral sciences. You'll want to search a word that's found in the reference, such as an author surname, a publication title, or keywords in an article title.
- **Import** an RIS file from reference management software. See our Import References handout (PDF, size) for more information about RIS import.
- **Create** a reference using one of dozens of templates to properly cite a work, such as a journal article, book chapter, podcast, or blog comment.

The Paper Reference List

Each paper in the Writing Center has its own **Paper Reference List**. Here, you add, edit, sort, and delete references for that particular paper.



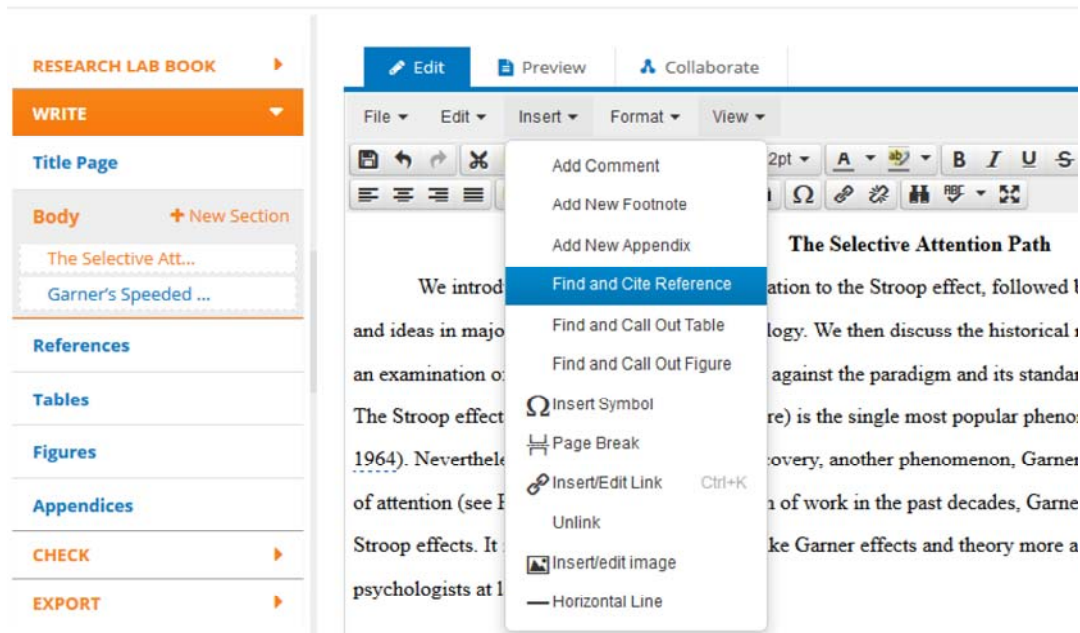

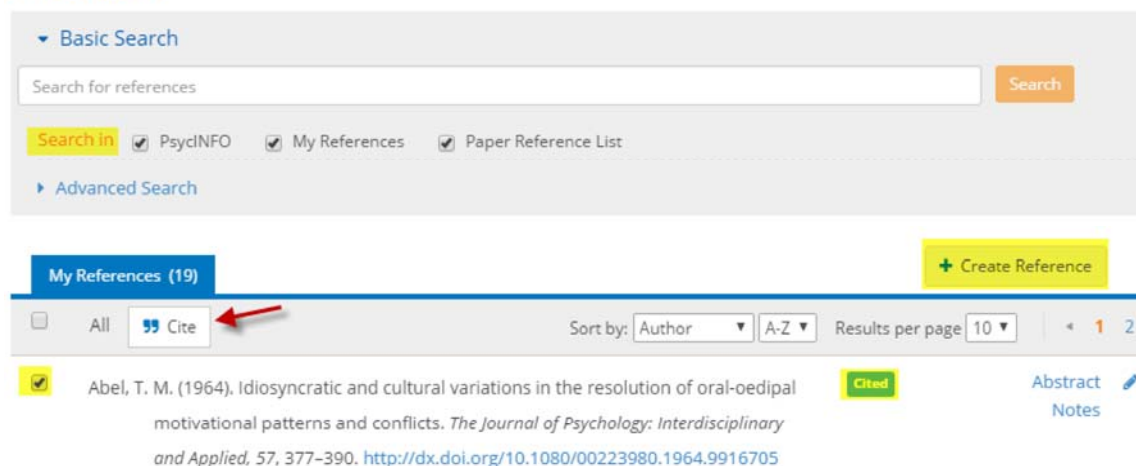
In-Text Citations

To cite a work in the body of the paper, click on the desired location in the text (often at the end of a sentence). Once the cursor is placed, open the **Insert** menu and select **Find and Cite Reference**. (You can also access this menu by right-clicking on the desired place in the text.)



My References is displayed, and the references already cited within this paper are indicated with the green **Cited** icon. To cite from **My References**, check the box and click Cite. On this page, you can also search within adapted PsycINFO references, **My References**, or **Paper Reference List**; or create a reference from a template.

You will need to answer two formatting questions before your citation appears in the text.

A parenthetical citation refers to the cited work in parentheses.
 Example: Autonomy and personal growth are linked to psychological well-being (Riff & Keyes, 1995).

A narrative citation refers to the cited work as part of the main sentence. Example: Riff and Keyes (1995) found that autonomy and personal growth are linked to psychological well-being.

Cited references cannot be deleted. To delete a reference from the **Paper Reference List**, the citations must first be removed from the body of the paper. Trying to delete a reference from the list when it is still cited results in an error.
